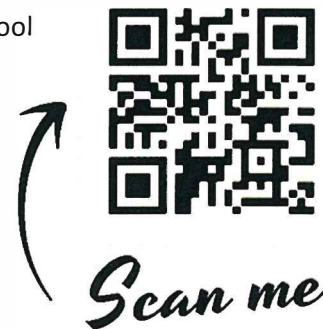
Dear Warrior Tribe:

We continue to develop a system to improve the flow of information, assignments, and meals to our students and families. As mechanisms are developed over the coming days, we will communicate important updates to you.

Our current plan is to begin providing meals to students effective tomorrow, March 17<sup>th</sup>. A link has been added to our website, [www.m-ecs.org](http://www.m-ecs.org), for families to place orders. Pickup will be available between 10:30 AM and 12:30 PM at both school buildings. Meal deliveries will be coordinated with those requiring it.

Please note that all meals under this program are free, regardless of families qualifying for free/reduced lunch. The Federal Government reimburses school districts for the costs associated with these meals. It actually helps local schools when more families participate in these programs. Don't shy away from the offerings, we are happy to help and serve you.

Today our teachers had an opportunity to meet with your children. They provided students review assignments, with the expectation that all tasks are completed. Teachers have responded incredibly with an eagerness to support your children remotely the best they can. Faculty and staff will utilize computers as a means of communication, and phones when necessary.

We are in the process of reviewing data submitted through the recent surveys. It is our hope that soon we will have a handle on our students who need technology supports including hot spots, computing devices, and other needs. Our current priority is to equip all special needs students with appropriate accommodations as soon as possible. We are exploring ways to uniquely deliver required services to those identified. When we know we can deliver acceptable services to those with unique needs, then we will explore our ability to provide new material to our general education students as required by law.

For families looking for ways to support their children more deeply than what we can currently offer, consider online learning games, activities, and other resources.
